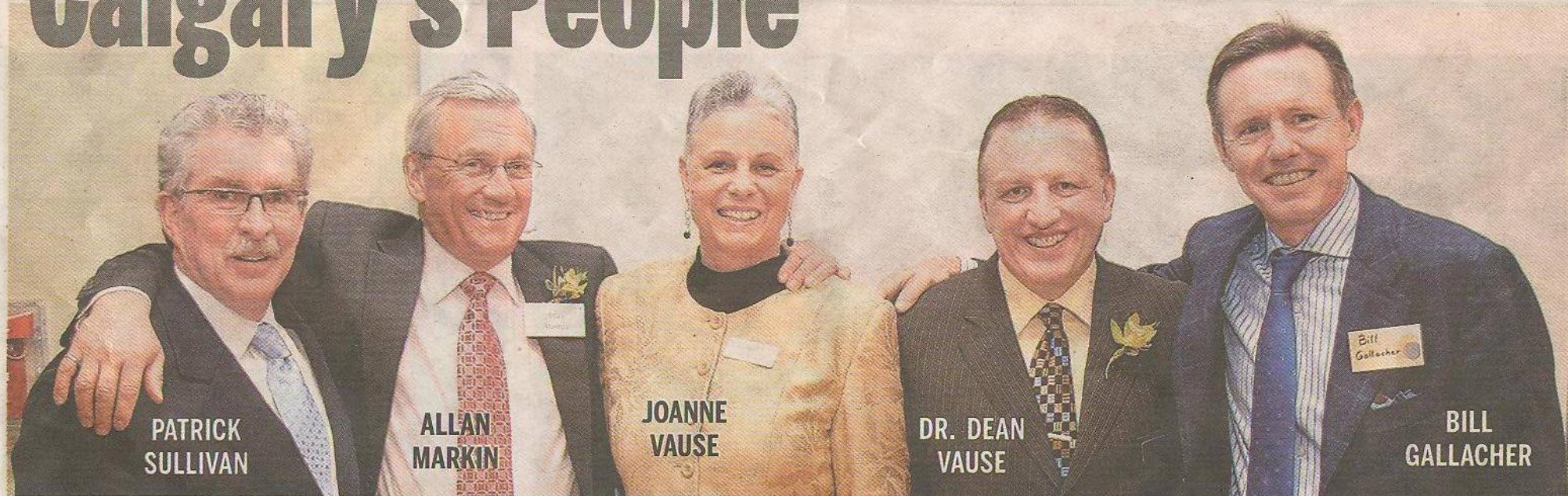


# Calgary's People
